



### A Message From Our CEO...



## **COVID** Impact

Alcohol Consumption during the COVID-19 Pandemic: **A Cross-Sectional Survey of US Adults** 



\*In a sample of 832 participants, almost two-thirds reported that their drinking had increased, compared to before COVID-19. The study concluded that alcohol use in the U.S. is a public health problem that appears to have worsened since the onset of COVID-19.

Of patients report Dilworth Center's Telehealth platform is easy to use.





Thanks to the generous giving of our donors, Dilworth Center received more funds in 2020 than any year in our history.




# **SCHOLARSHIP IMPACT**
